Jubilee fun


On Friday 3 June, we celebrated Her Majesty The Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Rubbish rules

We hate moaning here at PETRA - but not as much as we hate clearing up after irresponsible residents. So can we just remind residents of the correct use of the orange bins.

The Orange Bins

Orange sacks go in the orange bins (Please do not leave whole boxes beside the bins) In those orange sacks, you can put: clean cans, long life cartons, foil, paper, card, plastic bottles, plastic food tubs, pots, bottle tops, microwave meal trays, cardboard boxes (flattened and folded into the bin).

Please **do not** put the following in the orange bins: food, garden waste, glass, Polystyrene, nappies, batteries and toys.

As well as orange bins, we have bottle banks, paper containers, textile containers and green containers dotted around the estate. If you are unsure about where to put any of your rubbish, please ask a member of staff.

Lifts update

The lifts replacement project continues to make good progress. There has inevitably been some disruption to residents, especially as the landing areas also require refurbishment as part of the project.

But now that Phase Two has begun, this disruption should now be at an end. That's because with one lift shift completed and now in use, all floors are now accessible. Work on the other lift has begun and should be completed on or around the end of the year.



Everyone agrees the new lift looks very swish, and it is good to know the upheaval is all worthwhile!

Traffic calming measures

And still we await the installation of the traffic calming measures to counter the dangers created by the traffic generated by the construction site on our doorsteps.

Whether we get the zebra crossing and speed humps needed before the building works are completed now begins to look doubtful.

Residents will have received a letter concerning a consultation, but only have until **14 July** to comment. As our wait continues, pedestrians and drivers both, please take extra care on or around the estate's entrance and exit routes.

Meanwhile, concern mounts over the impact of the new build on its neighbours, both here at PETRA and elsewhere.

Caroline Edwards writes:

"On 4 July, I attended a public meeting, where local residents expressed their concerns to the Council. The meeting was quite lively, as you can imagine. Havering said that once the consultation was complete they would be authorising the work to be done.

"But there was also lively discussion regarding privacy, as some residents in Uphavering House complained that the new build residents will be able to look directly into their flats, which isn't acceptable, and contravenes what was originally stated, ie that the new build would be no higher than 3-4 storeys. The build is now 10 storeys high.

"Havering said that they will hold further meetings, and we will keep you informed of these as they happen."

Now six weeks into my new job, I often visit up to nine housebound elderly people every day, and the difference I'm able to make is very rewarding.

For example, one elderly client, who has dementia, and who is often very confused and agitated, relaxed and felt calm when I began playing the old song 'We'll Meet Again' for him. He began singing, and we even had a little dance together! His daughter was delighted, and amazed. She hadn't seen her dad looking so happy in years.

Energy rebate

As the cost of living crisis hits home, make sure to take the financial support on offer

If you are a Council Tax band A to D household who does not pay Council Tax by direct debit, there is now a form that you can complete on Havering Council's website to get the Government's £150 energy rebate.

This will enable you to apply for your rebate to be paid into your bank account or your Council Tax account.

The aim is that these households receive their payment within ten working days of making their online application.

For more information including how to apply, go to the Havering website havering.gov.uk - and search Energy Bills Rebate 2022. Alternatively, contact Havering's Council Tax customer services team on 01708 433997 and someone will be able to help you complete it.

Winter Fuel Payment

If you were born on or before 25 September 1956 you could get between £250 and £600 to help you pay your heating bills. This is known as a 'Winter Fuel Payment'.

You will get your Winter Fuel Payment automatically (you do not need to claim) if you're eligible and either: • get the State Pension

• get another social security benefit (not Housing Benefit, Council Tax Reduction, Child Benefit or Universal Credit)

If you do not get either of these, you may need to make a claim. You can make a claim for a Winter Fuel Payment from 1 August 2022.

If you've got a Winter Fuel Payment before, you do not need to claim again unless you've deferred your State Pension or moved abroad.
